Ted: Why did the elephant wear a rubber hose around his neck?

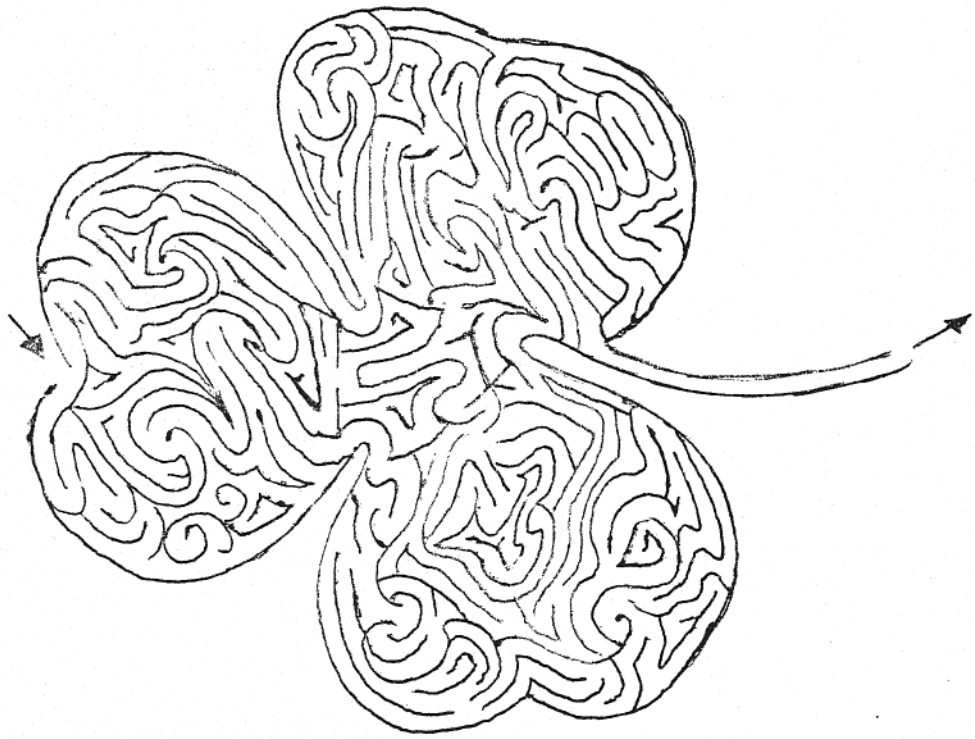
Ned: Because someone stole his necktie.

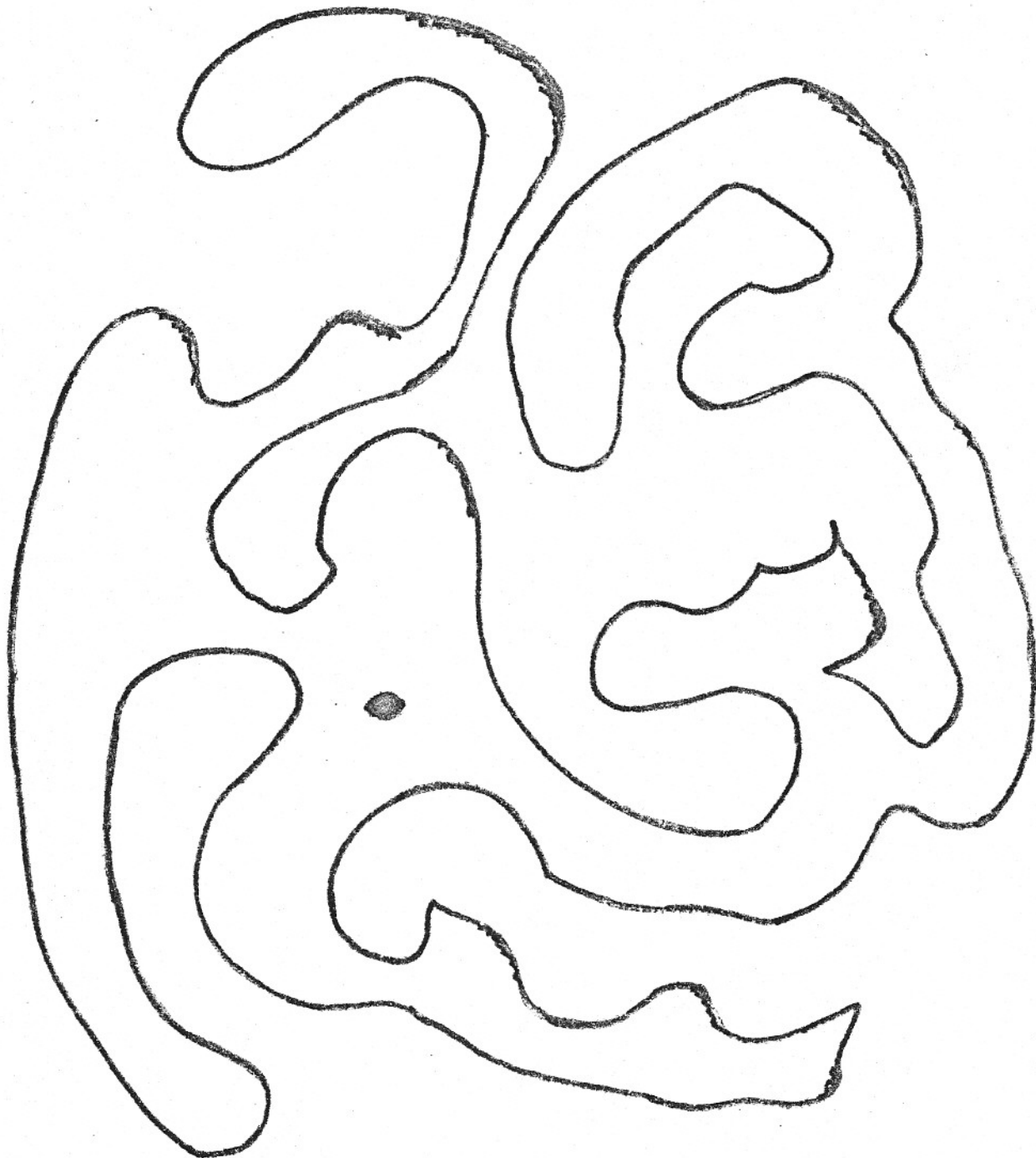
THEDRICK AND THE POT OF GOLD
