
## STEVE KAST'S RULES FOR POOL

Pool is an ancient game dating back to 1969 when I discovered it in a pool hall in Bromo California.



One last word of advice: When you are invited over to someones house to play pool, always remember to wear a swim suit. This will help to confuse your opponent.


